Of the top five places, CCCC members Jean Paley and Dave Stone took the first two places with their images "Blades" and "Dog Collar" respectively. Meng Horng and Andrea Monninger of the KodaRoamers split the other three places. Overall, our club received 24 of the 34 overall HMs.

Our members also did well at the CICCA Spring Salon in Peoria. One of our newer members, Charissa Lansing, won two Best of Show medallions with her "Sparkling Glory Bee" (Color Print) and "Intelligence" (Digital Nature). Our digital chairperson, Jim Long, won two medallions for "Low Nuts" (Digital Nature) and "Sangamon Forest Preserve Dreamscape" (Digital Creative/Contemp).

Our own CCCC club Spring Salon was held on April 17th. The Best of Show digital image was Jim Long's "Fog Light" and the Best of Show print was my (Mary Cattell's) "Recession Proof". We were delighted to see that many of our newer members placed well in the Salon with first places: David Stone's "Winter Twilight", Ron Payne's "Old Trolley" and Charissa Lansing's "Poinsettia Magic"
